

Rector's order
University of Economy in Bydgoszcz
of February 27, 2021

on: implementation of educational processes, including the organization of classes in relation to the prevention, counteraction and combating COVID-19 in the summer semester of the academic year 2020/2021

Based on Article. 51a and art. 198a of the Act of July 20, 2018 - Law on Higher Education and Science (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2020, items 85, 374, 695, 875 and 1086, or 2021, item 159) and the Regulation of the Minister of Education and Science of February 25, 2021 on the temporary limitation of the functioning of certain entities of the higher education and science system in connection with preventing, counteracting and combating COVID-19, I order, as follows:

§1

1. In the summer semester of the academic year 2020/2021, classes in studies, postgraduate studies and other forms of education at the University of Economy are conducted in a hybrid system (full-time and with the use of distance learning methods and techniques.). It is allowed that each of the forms of classes may be conducted in this system, as long as it is required by the achievement of learning outcomes, regardless of whether such form of classes has been appropriately provided for in the study program.
2. The head of the Scientific and Didactic Unit (JND) appoints classes which, due to the specificity of learning outcomes, must be completed, in full or in part, stationary (laboratory classes, workshops and others).
3. The classes referred to in paragraph 2 are conducted in the applicable sanitary regime, taking into account the decisions, recommendations and guidelines of the authorities of the Chief Sanitary Inspectorate and in accordance with the rules in force at the University.
4. Remote classes, referred to in paragraph 1, take place only through University's educational platforms or MS Teams.
5. The classes may be attended by foreigners studying under the Erasmus + program or other programs and international agreements implemented by the University.
6. Apprenticeships, including teaching, are carried out in the form of direct participation or remotely, in compliance with the applicable sanitary regime.

§2

1. Managers of JND are obliged to organize classes in specialist laboratories and laboratories in compliance with the applicable sanitary regime referred to in S 1 sec. 3, including the need to maintain an appropriate physical distance.
2. Research supervisors and promoters should create the possibility of continuing the research work of students in the hybrid system

§3

The lecturers are obliged to do on-call duty in a remote form at fixed hours, previously determined and announced in the internal IT system of the University.

§4

1. In the event of an increase of the level of risk, it is allowed to suspend scientific, sports and artistic events organized at the University.
2. The WSG library operates in accordance with the rules of the applicable sanitary regime. Detailed rules of operation are established by the Director of the Library

§5

1. Places in student dormitories will be allocated in accordance with the applicable rules, and staying in them requires compliance with the sanitary regime.
2. Before moving into the dormitory, the student is obliged to submit a declaration in accordance with the template constituting Annex 1 to this ordinance

§6

Foreign trips and arrivals of employees, WSG students and visits to the WSG of guests, in accordance with the University's strategy and the organization of the academic year, take place in accordance with generally applicable epidemic safety rules

§7

The rules set out in this ordinance regarding the implementation of educational processes may change depending on the epidemic situation. The regulation comes into force on the date of its signing and is valid until further notice.
